



Charles Irwin Westbrooks

April 5, 1935 - April 24, 2025

Charles Irwin Westbrooks, Sr. passed away peacefully in Monroeville, PA on April 24, 2025.

Raised in Homestead, Charles attended Homestead public schools, graduating in 1954. In 1955, Charles enlisted in the United States Air Force. Upon his honorable discharge, Charles returned home to Homestead and married Marjorie Ann Twyman. Charles joined the Homestead Police Department in 1960. He earned an Associate's degree from the Community College of Allegheny County, a Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology from the University of Pittsburgh and a Master of Arts degree in Criminal Justice from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. In 1977, Charles retired from the Homestead Police Department and accepted a position at the University of Pittsburgh, Office of Community Relations. He was a highly regarded instructor at the Allegheny County Police Academy and later taught Criminology at Duquesne University and Indiana University of Pennsylvania. In 1983, Charles became Director of Campus Security and Special Assistant to the President at the University of Pittsburgh at Greensburg Campus, where he also taught criminology. He retired from the university and teaching in 2005 and 2008, respectively.

He leaves to cherish his wife of 65 years, Marjorie, his children Charles Irwin, Jr., Barrett Alan (Willa), Alyson Rene (Pierre), Donna Marie (Jeffrey), Elaine Louise (John), and Franklin John (Nyjah). He was preceded in death by his

daughter, Denise. In addition to his children, Charles is survived by six grandchildren, four siblings, many nieces, nephews and friends.

A memorial service to honor Charles will be take place on Saturday, May 17, 2025, 2:00pm at Tunie Funeral Home, 218 E. 11th Ave., Homestead. A meet and greet of family and friends will be held that same day at 12:00pm to 2:00pm.
