Cheryl Collins Chapman, 73, of Homestead, PA, passed away on Monday June 22, 2020 at home. She was born on April 19, 1947 in Pittsburgh, PA to Jessie Weems Chapman and James Albert Chapman, longtime Homestead residents. She was a lifelong Homestead resident and was an active member of Second Baptist Church, where she was a Sunday school teacher. Cheryl had two careers, first as a Special Education teacher in various school districts, including McKeesport, Steel Valley and Propel; followed by a community activist as a member of the Homestead Borough Council and organization "Three Boro" among many other volunteer activities. She took great pride in all things related to Homestead, especially the Homestead Grays, of which her grandfather was a member. She was very artistic, and took up hobbies that brought her joy, such as designing greeting cards. She was also an inventor and held a patent. She is survived by her nieces and nephew, Todd Hunter Chapman and his wife Marcy Chapman, Christina Hunter Chapman and her husband Derrick Dennis, and Kathryn Hunter Chapman who will miss trips to Sancastle and Kennywood with her, as well as many cousins on the Chapman and Weems sides. She is predeceased by her sister Christine "Cathy" Chapman and brother, James "Todd" Chapman.
