Danielle Lea Dobbs was born November 24, 1979, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. She was the oldest child of Patti Tunie and Lee Robert Dobbs, III. She, and her 3 siblings were raised in the Penn Hills section of the city where she was a 1998 graduate of Penn Hills High School. Even though Penn Hills was home, the family had deep roots in Homestead. Christ was the cornerstone of life in the Dobbs home and Danielle accepted the Lord as her Savior at an early age. She was a lifelong member of Clark Memorial Baptist Church, initially under the pastorate of her great uncle, the late Reverend Dr. Donald A. Tunie. As a toddler in church she would lift her small arms up in praise and was more than willing to pray over the smallest scratch that her parents or a family member might have, Shortly after her first birthday Danielle was diagnosed with sickle cell anemia. Her struggle with this disease would be the backdrop of her entire life, but she absolutely refused to let sickle cell define who she was. After high school she held a number of clerical positions before gaining employment with the County Of Allegheny in the Recorder of Deeds. She was a faithful and dedicated employee and remained with the County until her health no longer permitted her to do so. Danielle was a fun loving and outgoing individual. She loved being in the company of her sisters and brother and her good friends, most of whom she had known since childhood, traveling, cooking, and enjoying a good meal, and was always up for a shopping trip. On a more serious side, she was a history buff and an avid reader. The most defining moment in Danielle's life occurred in 2005 with the birth of her beloved son, Christopher. She was a caring and devoted mother who loved her son with all her heart. They shared a special bond and he was the love of her life.

On the morning of March 29, 2016 the Lord, in His infinite wisdom, called Danielle Lea Dobbs home.
