JOHN M. HARRIS WAS BORN ON JULY 13, 1930 IN HOLLISTER, NORTH CAROLINA TO THE LATE MASON AND SUE TAYLOR HARRIS. HE WAS THE YOUNGEST OF SIX SIBLINGS. HE LEFT ALL HIS EARTHLY AILMENTS FOR ETERNAL JOY AND HAPPINESS ON TUESDAY DECEMBER 11, 2018 AT 9:30 P.M. AT THE VA HOSPITAL IN ASPINWALL, PA.

JOHN ATTENDED LOCAL SCHOOL AND AFTER GRADATION JOINED THE US ARMY WHERE HE SERVED IN THE KOREAN CONFLICT AND WAS HONORABLE DISCHARGED IN 1952. HE WOULD COME HOME AND BE EMPLOYED AT THE CIVIC ARENA IN PITTSBURGH IN THE MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT UNTIL HIS RETIREMENT.

FROM A YOUNG AGE HE WAS INVOLVED IN THE CHURCH AND WAS AN ACTIVE MEMBER OF MORNINGSTAR UNTIL HIS ILLNESS PREVENTED HIM FROM REGULAR ATTENDANCE. HE COULD BE SEEN ANY GIVEN SUNDAY WITH HIS WALKER SITTING IN THE FRONT PEW WHERE THEY WOULD HAND HIM A MIKE SO HE COULD JOIN IN THE CHURCH SERVICE. EVEN IN HIS ILLNESS HE NEVER STOPPED PRAISING AND WORSHIPPING THE GOD HE SERVED.

JOHN WAS AN AWESOME BASEBALL PLAYER AND HAD BEEN COURTED BY SEVERAL MINOR LEAGUE TEAMS IN HIS YOUTH.

BUT HIS TRUE PASSION WAS HIS LOVE OF SINGING ABOUT THE GOODNESS OF GOD. ANYONE THAT KNEW JOHN HAS EXPERIENCED THAT ROBUST VOICE THAT GRACED CHURCHES AND EVENTS ALL OVER THE TRI STATE AREA. HE WAS PART OF MANY GOSPEL GROUPS AND WELL RESPECTED IN THE SINGING CIRCLES AROUND THE AREA. HE ALSO WROTE AND SANG HIS OWN MUSIC.

HE WAS PRECEDED IN DEATH BY SIBLINGS GEORGE HARRIS, ETHEL CYRUS, MYRA BREWINGTON, THELMA JOHNSON AND MILDRED MORGAN AND SON, JOHN HARRIS JR.
