Martha Brunson Hinson, lovingly known to all as "Sis" was born on June 14, 1912 in Manning, South Carolina to the late Chester and Mittie Brunson. God sent her here to visit for awhile and then at 4:30 am on November 13, 2013 Martha said goodbye to this world as God was saying welcome back.

In 1936 Martha, Mary Lumsden (her twin sister) and Leander Felder (her eldest sister) moved to Homestead where on April 25, 1939 she met and married the late William Kennie Hinson. Once leaving her residence on Hays Street Martha moved to the Munhall Retirement Residence. In 2011 until her death she resided at the Commons Nursing Facility in Squirrel Hill.

Martha joined Park Place Church and became very active. She joined the Mary A. Bumery Missionary Society where she served as Secretary, Treasurer and later became the President and held this office for 13 years. She is a "76" year member of the WMS.
