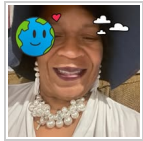

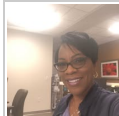
I know the angels rejoiced when Ms. Nancy arrived in heaven but as I did a few years back, I'm sure your grieve for the loss of your mother.
