While in the air force Junjer played trumpet with the renowned Air Force Band, thus began his thirst for international travel. After leaving the air force Junjer married Sylvia Shelton and attempted to live a normal settled life. That was NOT in his genes and soon he was on the road traveling with the Platters and singing internationally. Along came love and in May of 1980 he married Donna J. Chudoba. 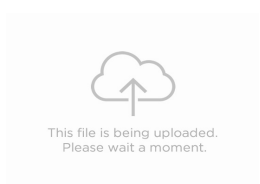
